#### The Promises

For this alcoholic the promises seemed like a gimmick when I arrived in AA. After all if you had my kids you'd drink too - if you had my mother you'd drink even more!! You see I was convinced I was not an alcoholic and you were all going to find out my secret and ask me to leave. That was almost two years ago. AA was a place for me to bring my alcoholic friends, a place I could go and try to convince myself that I was better than most, a place where God was a crutch and sobriety just an illusion. How could anyone possibly go 2 months without drinking, never mind 20 years? They had to be lying - in front of God no less.

And then there were the promises and acceptance prayer-simple yes but clearly unattainable. Who could possibly buy into this crap? It was as if these people had been brainwashed, zombies walking around mumbling phrases like: Life gets better when I come to AA, I don't have to pick up a drink even if I want to, Do the right thing and the right thing will happen, and God is doing for me what I cannot do for myself. I was convinced these were secret codes, and only a real alcoholic could decipher them.

However, I had decided to stick around until someone, anyone who was not drinking could advise me that I was not an alcoholic. All my drinking buddies knew I wasn't, but I needed more solid proof. And what better proof than that from a person who really was an alcoholic. And so my undercover mission began.

I showed up every day and began gathering information. It was not long before my image of an alcoholic, which was a man in a trench coat with a brown paper bag sleeping in a vacant lot next to a woman with a bent overstuffed shopping cart, began to fade. I soon realized I was surrounded by business people in suits, teachers, lawyers, even a doctor. How could this be? It was not long before I started listening to them speak. Their thoughts were mine. It was as if someone had woken up the shadows in my mind. The more they expressed their experiences the more I wanted to come. AA became that book that I just couldn't put down until it was finished. And I have not been able to put it down yet, and I am told it will never be finished and this I believe.

I put down the drink January 1, 2008 and have not found it necessary to pick one up since then even though it was my mission to do so. The information I have gathered over the years has only strengthened and reaffirmed what I was told from the beginning. And two years into this journey, just completing step four I am truly amazed and I am not even halfway through. I do know a new freedom...from that bondage of myself. My thoughts are no longer directed towards me and what I want...but more towards how can I help those around me whether it be my children, my customers, my boyfriend and my parents. What is truly amazing is they used to be the reasons I drank and today they are not only gifts but sources of gratitude as well.

Today I have been able to make peace with my past, begin repairing the damage the wreckage has caused with the help of AA, and the 12 steps, as well as the help of my sponsor, the support of my home group and the guidance of my higher power, one day at a time. And today instead of wallowing in self pity, thinking no one understands me, or feeling as though I am being persecuted, I know that no matter what happens, whatever life hands me today I will get through it without that drink as long as I keep practicing those 12 steps of AA. I am no longer undercover. I am now a useful active member of AA sharing my experience, strength and hope one day at a time. Letting God do for me what I could not do for myself. Camille K

For this alcoholic the most important promises are the last two and the manner in which they impact my life on a daily basis. I have been promised that if I attend meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous with an open mind and avail myself of the experience, strength and hope that is shared, "we are going to know a new freedom and a new happiness." I'm not sure that any one of us shows up at a meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous with the express mindset of getting intuition. Invariably, however, something is said that I need to hear. I may not need to process or understand it at that exact moment. Then it happens: I am faced with something I've never experienced before. That is when intuition, defined as 'quick and sudden insight', manifests itself when "we will intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle us."

In the 12 and 12, Bill writes in step 10 that "we are today sober only by the grace of God and that any success we may be having is far more His success than ours." That sure sounds like the promise that "we will suddenly realize that God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves." The next time you are at a meeting where the promises are read, you will be asked, "Are these extravagant promises?" How very true is the response, "We think not."

In conclusion, I only ask that you make one promise to me. Promise that the next time you see me at a meeting you will tell me just how good your life is on the basis of the promises and how they have materialized based on the work you have done. with grateful heart, Don H.

#### Step Twelve and the Newcomer

When I was a newcomer and stranded in the black hole between the 3rd and 4th step an old timer made a comment about what "faking it till I make it" meant. I believed in a higher power and didn't know how to trust one. The old guy then made me read Step Twelve to him. Despite my resistance and questions as how that was gonna help me I read it to him. "Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps..."

"Stop" he said, and made me read it again. He carefully explained that there in front of me was a promise, it does not say "may have" or "could have" it said "having had". It was then told to me if I can hang on long enough to work the twelve steps to the best of my ability that the spiritual angle will fall into place and it will be a matter of maintaining my spirituality on a daily basis. This has happened. Over time I understood that I understand little of my higher power and that's how it should be. My understanding has room to grow and will as long as I practice these principles in all my affairs. Surrender to win. Still Dan
