
- 1. What is your number one reason for getting involved in service?

A Slap In The Face

Too often I hear the misguided perception that service work is too "political". When I go to a District meeting or an Area Assembly, I hear people passionate about service engaging in debate. Once in awhile it may get a little heated but that's the passion.

However everyone on every floor I have every sat on has one thing in common. They have the passion and RESPONSIBILITY to do the best they can for AA. When a person "bad mouths" service it is because they have never served on the floor or didn't serve long enough. I often have disagreements with people in the assembly, but in the end most people trust that the Higher Power as expressed through the group conscience is the ultimate authority.

Behind every meeting are hours of service work from the District to New York. While often underappreciated these people seek no recognition or compensation. I have often been asked why I do the service I do; my answer is I hope and pray that AA will be here for your grandchildren's children. This cannot be accomplished through prayer; (although prayer guides my decisions) it must be done through countless hours of uncompensated work. Imagine no meeting list, no functions or Alcathon, no hotlines, no literature. I could continue this list forever. None are good choices. Most alcoholics, I've found, have a unique physical anomaly - they have these special invisible earflaps that close when they get scolded, or lectured, or told. Defiance is a common characteristic, you know. So, I decided instead on the Truth. What a concept. The Truth is, you might never know the impact that being involved in Service may render. You might never be around to see how, in a hundred years, because of your involvement in Service, a seemingly hopeless alcoholic comes to a meeting and feels that first inkling of hope. But you can be assured, at some point it will happen. Seventy five years ago two alcoholics had no idea what this organization would ultimately mean to the world, to recovering alcoholics, AND to all those people we affect. I like to think that someday, when my son or his daughter or grandson need a meeting, need some hope, it will be here for them because of people that are involved in its future – today. The Truth is that the people that "run" AA at the service level are us, you and me. And the truth is that when you get such an immeasurable gift back by such a small investment, there are no thanks necessary, because any would pale in comparison to the true thanks. I have the deep certainty that if we could actually see the true ramifications of the benefits of what we do for others, (hence for ourselves), the line would be out the door for people wanting to get involved. So, thank the people that volunteer, but remember that they get the ultimate thanks already. And, if you're not involved, at your group, or sponsorship, or Service level, it's not "shame on you", it's "sorry, you don't know what you're missing". Lance
